Strategy in Place

Invest in cutting-edge treatment technologies and standard practices to proactively prevent pollution and runoff measures to ensure that Onancock's picturesque creeks and estuaries remain pristine.
4. **Onancock Emergency Water Response Plan:** Develop a tailored emergency response plan with the Accomack Emergency Response Team to account for Onancock's unique geography and vulnerability to coastal storms and sea level rise. Coordinate closely with neighboring communities and emergency services to ensure swift action in the event of a water-related crisis with a clear chain of command and defined roles.
5. **Onancock Water Conscious Community:** Cultivate a culture of water consciousness among Onancock's residents and visitors, celebrating the town's maritime heritage while promoting responsible water use. Use the LAC to Host educational events at the Onancock Wharf and partner with local schools to instill a sense of stewardship for the region's water resources.
6. **Onancock Sustainable Water Practices:** Embrace sustainable water practices that reflect Onancock's commitment to preserving its natural beauty and supporting its vibrant ecosystem. Explore innovative solutions such as our Tree Board and Waterfront committees to minimize environmental impact and enhance resilience.
7. **Onancock Water Funding Strategy:** Make every effort to secure funding for essential water infrastructure projects through grants, public-private partnerships, and targeted investments. Ensure that Onancock's water rates remain fair and equitable, balancing the need for financial sustainability with affordability for all residents.
8. **Onancock Collaborative Water Management:** Foster collaboration among Onancock's diverse stakeholders, including local government agencies, conservation groups, and commercial fishermen. Leverage the town's strong sense of community to develop shared solutions that benefit both people and nature.
